The ELIA Leadership Symposium offers an open and vital space for leaders to come together and explore how to navigate ongoing change and uncertainty.

If you are already stepping into leadership within your artistic practice or creative education community, this is your chance to connect with international changemakers, contribute your perspective, and immerse yourself in discussions shaping the future of higher arts education.

Over three days, you will take part in a curated programme of high-level sessions, keynotes, panels, performances, and interactive breakout sessions addressing the pressing challenges faced by higher arts education today. This is an exceptional opportunity to connect with rectors, deans, artists, cultural practitioners, curators, directors and presidents of leading arts universities from across the world - right in the heart of Geneva.

### WHO CAN APPLY?

Students from ELIA member institutions at any level (bachelor, master, or PhD) are eligible to apply for the student bursaries.

Important: Due to the limited time before the event, students applying for bursaries must hold the necessary documentation to enter

Switzerland without requiring a visa. Please ensure your travel documentation allows for visa-free entry before applying for financial support.

Students should provide the following in their application:

- Contact details
- Institution details and proof of enrolment
- Evidence of visa-free entry to Switzerland
- Biography
- Motivation to join the Symposium
- Any relevant experiences or projects

Submission deadline: 15 September 2025



APPLICATIONS must be completed in English using this <u>online form</u>; any APPLICATIONS not following these requirements will not be considered.


